

## From the DAMASCUS Ministry Team

"D-Day" -- June 6th 2024 is the 80th anniversary of D-Day; the Normandy invasion which was to become one of the greatest turning points of WW2. This event is in living memory for some, and for the rest of us, it is an event to reflect upon.

One of the many things Jesus said, and the strength of his teaching, is that we are to love one another. Love your neighbour as ourselves. "Greater love has no one than this, that he lay down his life for his friends", which is what Jesus did. Here Jesus is telling his friends what he was about to do. This particular verse (John 15:13) was used many times during WW1 to mean "you must go off to the front line, and if necessary, die for your country". From a Christian perspective, this verse was taken out of context and used to put moral pressure on people. This sits uneasily alongside a passage like this one where the talk is of love, not war.

The poetry of **Wilfred Owen** describes very insightfully, the situation he found on the front line. "The scribes on all the people shove and bawl allegiance to the state, but they who love the greater love, lay down their life, they do not hate".

This reminds me of that well known quote from Martin Luther King Jr. "Darkness cannot drive out darkness, only light can do that. Hate cannot drive out hate, only love can do that."

We cannot legislate for love, but Jesus can command those who follow him and his example, to love. <u>Let us remind ourselves</u> at this time of the D-Day anniversary, of those who have made the self-sacrifice of laying down their life. Let us also remind ourselves of those who, today, **sincerely believe in doing their duty for others**.



This will be an unusually short report (I can hear the cheers!).

\*\*The regular monthly Parish Council meeting was postponed until 28th May so the PC has not met since I submitted my last report. The postponement of the normal meeting was to enable the Finance Committee to ratify the year-end accounts for the PC (& pushed it past when this issue had to reach the printer!).

There is one really **important item** to inform you of. The PC website now contains **draft designs** for the **proposed new pedestrian crossing** at Abingdon Road/Chestnut Drive and also at the High Street.

Please have a look at these plans and send any comments to the Parish Council. We do not yet have a firm timetable for their implementation but have asked Oxfordshire County Council and their contractor to treat these as priority. 

# UK passports: Don't get caught out!

The price of a getting or renewing a UK passport has risen for the second time in 14 months.

Meanwhile, UK holidaymakers travelling to the EU are being warned not to get caught out by the "10-year rule".

How much does it cost to get or renew my passport?

It now costs £88.50 to get, renew or replace your passport if you apply online, external, up from £82.50, or £100 for a postal application, up from £93.

An online application for a child's passport costs £57.50, up from £53.50, or £69 via post, up from £64.

It costs more if you apply from abroad, or if you require a passport urgently. Passports are free for people born on or before 2 September 1929.

The increased fees apply to both new passport applications and renewals. Prior to last year's rise, passport fees had not gone up for five years and a standard adult online application cost £75.50.

The Post Office, meanwhile, said its "check and send" service will still be on offer for £16.

#### When should I renew my passport?

You must renew your passport before you travel if either: 1) your passport has expired

- 2) your date of issue was more than 10 years ago (if travelling to countries with the 10-year rule)
- 3) your passport does not have enough time left before it expires.

How much time you need on your passport depends on where you are going. You can check entry requirements, for individual countries on the UK government's website {see https://www.gov.uk/foreigntravel-advice}.

How do my I renew my passport?

You can renew online at HM Passport Office, {see https://www.gov.uk/renew-adult-passport/renew} or by filling in a paper application from certain Post Offices.

You'll need your old passport and any valid passports you hold from a different country.

It should take up to three weeks to renew a passport in the UK, **but it can take longer**, during periods of high demand, such as before school holidays.

# **Your District Councillor**



#### **Halls Close**

The developers at Hall's Close have put in an application for a change to the Condition placed upon the development that states that "the full Foul Water drainage system shall be installed prior to first occupation." They are asking for a change to allow a "gravityfed Foul drainage system" to be used for the

first five houses, whilst the rest will go on a pumped system.

I am obviously not an expert in foul water drainage systems, but I instinctively get <u>alarmed at any hints of developers</u> <u>looking for a shortcut to the drainage systems</u>, given all the problems we've had with Thames Water and the drains around the High Street. I've therefore asked for this change to be "called in" to the Vale Planning Committee to **ensure it's thoroughly debated**. It may be that I'm just being alarmist, but I want them to make damn sure of it first.

#### **Drayton Post Office**

Unfortunately I've got no further information on this (I have no privileged source of information other than going in and talking to the people in the shop, which I've been doing). I'm told that they're very actively seeking a new postmaster, but that's all I've got for now, unfortunately. Hopefully, there may be better news by the time you read this in the Chronicle!

#### Police and Crime Commissioner Election

**Matthew Barber** was re-elected as Police and Crime Commissioner for Thames Valley, with 32.1% of the vote on a turnout of 24.4%. That means only 7.8% of registered voters voted for the winner (and even fewer for the other candidates).

#### Leisure Centre upgrades

We've received developer contributions (of £165,000) to **upgrade the tennis courts at White Horse Leisure and Tennis Centre** in Abingdon installing a new sand-based Artificial Turf Pitch (ATP) at four tennis courts at the centre. The new surface means the tennis courts can be used in all weather conditions throughout the year. The old astroturf has been stored for possible repurposing (eg for outdoor classrooms, community landscaping projects for erosion control, for temporary events, or even a putting green).

In addition, contractors have been appointed to install the **multi-million pound major energy-saving work** at both White Horse Leisure and Tennis Centre and Wantage Leisure Centre. This will involve the installation of insulation, new windows, solar panels, air source heat pumps and external wall insulation. Once completed, the measures should help reduce the council's overall carbon emissions by more than 25 per cent. This work is expected to be completed by March 2025. This also follows the installation of solar panels and air source heat pumps at Faringdon Leisure Centre last year. Those measures should save around 500,000kWh of energy over a year – the equivalent to the annual electricity use of 135 houses.

#### Cost of Living

#### Reservoir

Despite Thames Water appearing to try to imply they've had the go-ahead for the reservoir (possibly I'm being unduly sensitive, though?), **they most certainly have not**. They've been allowed to start work on examining a section of the soil to see if it's even possible to hold back all that water.

GARD have obtained (via a Freedom of Information request) a copy of the **Environment Agency's advice** to the Secretary of State on the Thames Water plan. It's significant that they recommended that Thames Water is not allowed to publish their plan as it stood in December (ie, **it is not acceptable as it stands**). They also advise that DEFRA consider whether further public scrutiny is required even after changes are made.

A leading authority on Embankment Designs & reservoirs has also carried out an independent review and is scathing about the state of the design and it appears it has been sent around the expert circles.

**To update my comment a while back** about the inability to even fill up Farmoor reservoir during the wettest winter on record — let alone further fill up something more than ten or eleven times larger than Farmoor on top of this:- I'm advised that it's not down to the sewage discharges. Or at least, not solely due to them. It's apparently due to unavoidable silt entering the river during wet winters.

This actually means that **it's even worse** for TW's reservoir plan: whilst it may be theoretically possible to resolve the sewage issues (even if TW aren't really credible there), it is literally impossible to prevent silting in wet winters. As they can't refill the damn thing without multiple years of ideal conditions (and if conditions are ideal, it's never needed!), it's obviously just a colossal and damaging white elephant unless water transfers are set up from wetter areas of the country to fill it. **But** >>> if we have the water transfer system set up – it's redundant! It can only be needed if Thames Water fall out with other water companies, which really doesn't strike me as a decent reason to spend billions, wreck the local environment, cause increased flooding, risk catastrophic damage in case of dam-breach events, and likely cause frequent fog-stoppages on the A34 and Great Western Rail.

#### Meadow areas to be allowed to grow

What **does** work, and help the environment, is increasing a biodiversity-friendly approach to land management. Vale have therefore been **deliberately allowing grass to grow** on sections of land the Council own or manage. This year there are **sites marked with meadow area signage** across the district in Abingdon, Botley, Faringdon, Marcham and Wantage.

# GARD -- Group Against Reservoir Development

When GARD issued its call for a Public Inquiry, we asked via Freedom of Information request to see the Environment Agency's advice to Secretary of State, Steve Barclay, on the Thames Water plans.

Finally last month, DEFRA agreed to our request and released the EA's advice, revealing that the EA have serious reservations about the plan, and quite a few of these echo GARD's criticisms about lack of substantiation that SESRO represents the best value plan, and our doubt on its resilience to droughts, amongst others. However, the most important take-away from this advice is the EA recommendation on page 6-7 in the Executive Summary:-"We recommend that:-

Thames Water is not allowed to publish its plan. The company should make further changes as set out in ... These changes will require regulators to review them before the company's plan is allowed to be published. We also advise that due to the public interest shown in the consultation that Defra considers whether further public scrutiny is required before the plan is published. "

Not being allowed to "publish the plan" equates to the plan not being acceptable as it stands. Clearly our call for a Public Inquiry has stayed the Barclay's hand, reinforced by the EA opinion.



# **WESTMINSTER VIEW**



Our MP (Wantage/Didcot) is David Johnston (OBE, awarded for services to Social Mobility and Education).

He is presently Minister for Children, Families and Wellbeing at the Department for Education

[Ed:- That could well of course change after the July 4th election].

I have had a number of meetings in the last month to progress **various local campaigns** that are a priority for me and my constituents.

I met with the Health Minister to again push my campaign for better local health services and for our infrastructure to keep pace with all the new housing that is being built. For the year ending Oct 2023, there were 50.9 million more GP appts compared to Oct 2019 - but there's more to do. Improving our health services is a key campaign and I am pleased the Minister has agreed to write to the local health leaders on our behalf.

I met with the Water Minister to again raise constituent concerns about the proposed reservoir and to call for public scrutiny of the proposal. In December, I wrote to the Environment Secretary about this, echoing GARD's call for public scrutiny and have been regularly raising concerns with Thames Water and the Environment Agency, who I took to Steventon recently where I discussed it with them.

This meeting came just before we got the great news that **Wallingford Beach** has officially been designated as a bathing water site by the Government. This is something that residents have long been calling for and the Water Minister has rightly recognised the strong show of local support. [Ed's note:Thames Water have it on their list to pollute though . . .]

I took Niamh Dernie, from Grove, to meet the Minister for **Victims and Safeguarding** so she could tell the Minister about her campaign against the sexual harassment she and her friends have experienced and what she would like to see happen.

It was also great to welcome the **Science Minister** to meet with and take questions from our great local science and technology organisations at my latest Wantage and Didcot Science and Technology Forum. I was glad to hear the Minister confirm that the Government will spend £20 billion on investment in science and research this year which is welcome news for our local sector.

In other news, I had the pleasure of hosting a reception at Number 10 Downing Street for people working in our great early years sector and was pleased to bring Julie, a childminder from Didcot who spent 14 years fostering around 30 families, as my guest to recognise her incredible efforts. It was a really uplifting atmosphere as MPs from across the country brought people they wanted to thank for the work they have been doing to shape young minds.

'Didcot TRAIN' works with young people, especially those who are disadvantaged or vulnerable and provides various essential services including youth clubs, mentoring and outreach programs. #### Down the Years



So, for this occasional venture back into the Pop Chart annals, who was charting THIS time of year, going back through time? Remember these? >>

In 2004, Peter Andre was in the charts with 'Insania' (referring to Katie Price?!), and Britney Spears was at #1 with 'Everytime'.

Back to **1994** – **Wet Wet Wet** were at #1 with ('Love Is All Around'), top selling single that year.

**40** years ago (is it REALLY so long?!) and we had an iconic #1 from Wham ('Wake me up before you Go-Go') & that was followed by Frankie Goes to Hollywood ('Two Tribes'). They (arguably) did us all a favour, by keeping Black Lace off the #1 slot (the wildly irritating 'Agadoo'). As in:- "AG-A-DOO Doo Doo, Push Pineapple, Shake The Tree" . . . . ah, they don't write 'em like that anymore.

That song was from France, via Morocco apparently, and was voted in 2000 as the 4th-most annoying song of all time. Only fourth?!

I tried to check what the three <a href="even more">even more</a> annoying ones were, but could only find 'The Birdie Song' – The Tweets in 1981. I also found that 'We Built This City' (Starship, 1985) is often voted "THE worst song of all time" (seems a bit harsh?) with 'Sussudio' (Phil Collins, also 1985) also popular as the SECOND-worst song ever. Another source put 'Don't Worry, Be Happy' (Bobby McFerrin, 1988) as more likely to have listeners smashing radios, they could be right?!

FIFTY years ago (for real old-timers), we'd just had The Rubettes ('Sugar Baby Love') at #1, and to follow came Charles Aznavour ("has no voice"?!) & 'She', plus George McCrae (Rock Your Baby'), with soon to follow the Three Degrees ('When Will I See You Again').

Anyone recall 1964?! Let me help:- this was a terrific few months, we'd just had Cilla Black ('You're My World') at the top, with Chuck Berry 'No Particular Place to Go', Lulu ('Shout'), and Mary Wells ('My Guy') just behind.

This month had the **Animals** and the iconic 'House of the Rising Sun' at #1 (the first #1 hit to have a playing time over 4 minutes). They were fronted by the gravel-voiced lead singer **Eric Burdon**, (83, still with us), and were praised by no less than rock icon **Bruce Springsteen** as being a major influence.

Coming up were **Dusty Springfield** ('I just don't know what to do with myself'), the **Stones** ('It's All Over Now'), the **Beach Boys** ('I Get Around'), the **Swinging Blue Jeans** ('You're No Good'), **Louis Armstrong** ('Hello Dolly') and the **Nashville Teens** ('Tobacco Road').

Sadly we lost actor **Mark McManus** ('Taggart' fame), also composer & conductor **Henry Mancini** (the 'Pink Panther' theme amongst many more).

FORTY years ago the Miners' Strike was still going strong, Virgin Atlantic had its first flight, and O-Level & CSE exams were combined into the new GCSE. We'd just lost much-loved Eric Morecambe and were about to lose Dame Flora Robson. Ghostbusters was the highest grossing film, and on TV we saw the first Crimewatch.

This month in 1974 – Jon Pertwee was replaced as Dr Who by Tom Baker, and Bob Monkhouse was about to be reinstated as host of The Golden Shot. Coming into the world that year were Victoria Beckham, Vernon Kay, Bear Grylls, Denise Van Outen, David Mitchell & Emilia Fox (Happy 50ths all?!!).

<u>Later that year</u>, ex-Cabinet Minister **John Stonehouse** was found in Australia (he'd faked his own death in Miami) – apparently Aussie police thought he was **Lord Lucan**!
